ABOUT THIS DEVOTIONAL

This journal encourages you to respond to the Spirit's personal and daily claim on your life. Focused on the events surrounding the launch of Jesus' ministry from Luke's Gospel, this journal aims to magnify Christ's faithfulness in a way that exposes our own faithlessness. Scripture tells how the people of God failed to produce a man who could pass through the waters, endure the wilderness, and serve God's mission in unbroken union with His Holy Spirit. Christianity is united around the claim that God became this man.

In Christ, our faithlessness is overcome by his remarkable faithfulness, and then we are re-gifted the call to pass through the waters, endure the wilderness, and serve God's mission in unbroken union with His Holy Spirit. As you meditate and pray, lean into the "today" of the Spirit's voice (Hb. 3:7-8) which urges us, between every sunrise and sunset, not to harden our hearts.

READ: LUKE 3:1-6

John came to enact that great vision of Isaiah, to level the playing field. Children of Abraham, the rich, the poor, tax collectors, and Roman soldiers...each received *a clear line of sight* through repentance and baptism. There is no vantage point better than this from which to see the salvation of God.

REPENTING INTO THE WATER

READ: LUKE 3:7-14

They came to be baptized and forgiven their sins. It's not clear these crowds came to turn away from their sins. John identifies two prevailing sins among the crowds: spiritual pride and greed. We are reminded that many social sins relate to money in some form or fashion, whether money extorted or money horded.

READ: LUKE 3:15-17

Water can wash away filth and remove a foul stench, but some things need to be purged. Jesus is too committed to our holiness to spare us fire. This is the Messiah's baptism, and through it he welcomes us into a life immersed in the Spirit.


PRAYER & REFLECTION:

PLEASING TO GOD

READ: 1 CORINTHIANS 10:1-5; LUKE 3:22

God takes no pleasure in wickedness-we get that. The story of scripture is, in many ways, an expression of God's commitment not just to have people he can show love to, but also a people he can take immense pleasure in. He found that person in Jesus.

READ: LUKE 3:23-38

The Son of God did not drop down from heaven as a fully formed human. Instead, he was born into the history of fallen humanity in order to *redeem* fallen humanity. Joseph's heritage became Jesus' heritage. As incredible as it sounds, the Son of God became a descendent of Adam, the son of God.

JANUARY 9TH

21 DAYS OF PRAYER & FASTING



TEMPTATION: SELF-SUFFICIENCY

READ: LUKE 4:1-4

Full of the Holy Spirit, Jesus leaves the water and goes into the wilderness where he will be met by the day's heat, the night's chill, hunger, and Satan. The public eye shifted from John to Jesus at Christ's baptism. But, rather than seize the "momentum" of that event, the Spirit thrusted Jesus into solitude and need. **PRAYER & REFLECTION:** WEEK 2 THEME: Temptation

WEEK 2 OBSERVATION:

JANUARY 12TH

21 DAYS OF PRAYER & FASTING

DEVOTION

READ: DEUTERONOMY 6:4-15

God's worth calls to you. It exposes your idols, elicits loving obedience, and cautions you against pride. As Moses preached, the surprising enemy of worship is often *forgetfulness*. Remind yourself of who God is and the life God has called you to. Write it on your entrances and exits; inscribe it into your lifestyle.

TEMPTATION: SHORTCUTS


READ: LUKE 4:5-8

MASSAH & MERIBAH

READ: EXODUS 17:1-7; DEUTERONOMY 6:16; PSALM 95:7-11

If we are honest, our journey with God includes Massah's, places where we demanded God prove himself to us under the threat that we will pull away from Him if He doesn't. Testing God expresses our desire to control God for our purposes, and in this, we resist our place as creatures and God's place as Creator.



Centuries later, the psalmists reflected upon that time and wrote their own songs of caution. AS LONG AS IT IS CALLED TODAY


READ: HEBREWS 3:13-4:5

"If you hear his voice," it is because the Spirit has opened your ears. If you hear, you can rest assured that you are inhabiting a sacred moment of grace, rather than personal acheivement. Your place is to listen and believe with the soft heart *God has given you* (see. Ez. 11:19-20). If our hearts are hard, that is our doing. **PRAYER & REFLECTION:** WEEK 3 THEME: Rejection

GOD'S SABBATH REST

READ: HEBREWS 4:6-13

The author of Hebrews recognizes that if David the psalmist (who lived long after Joshua) calls his own generation to enter God's rest, then Canaan must not have been God's final rest. Canaan was a downpayment of rest in Christ both present (v.3) and future (v.9-11), all of which harkens back to creation (v.4).


PRAYER & REFLECTION:

READ: LUKE 4:14-21

IS THIS JOSEPH'S SON?

READ: LUKE 4:22-30

We have heard it said that "familiarity breeds contempt." The people of Nazareth had an answer in mind about who the Messiah should be, and that answer didn't have in mind the guy who made their kitchen table. We also reject God's voice when it challenges our notion of who is worthy and who is unworthy. **PRAYER & REFLECTION:** **WEEK 3 THEME:** Rejection

WEEK 3 OBSERVATION:

JANUARY 22ND

FAITH IS THE DAILY BREAD GOD GIVES. YOU KNOW THE MANNA STORY: WHILE THE CHILDREN OF ISRAEL WERE IN THE WILDERNESS, THEY RECEIVED IT EVERY DAY, BUT AS SOON AS THEY TRIED TO STORE IT UP FOR THE NEXT DAY, IT SPOILED. SO IT IS WITH ALL GOD'S GIFTS. SO IT IS WITH FAITH TOO. EITHER WE RECEIVE IT ANEW EVERYDAY, OR IT DECAYS.

COMMON TO MAN

READ: LUKE 3:13; 1 CORINTHIANS 10:1-13

Paul explains that the Hebrews in the wilderness were not so different from Christians in Corinth. Spiritually speaking, Christ was the rock from which the Hebrews drank at Massah, and they tested Christ (v. 9). We must not grow complacent, because our baptismal identity and calling will be tested in the wilderness.



SERMON NOTES:

Meanwhile his disciples urged him, "Rabbi, eat something."

But he said to them, "I have food to eat that you know nothing about."

Then his disciples said to each other, "Could someone have brought him food?"

"My food," said Jesus, "is to do the will of him who sent me and to finish his work."
